Long-term Care Program in Glenwood Visitor Guidelines

Updated as of Friday, March 12, 2021

Due to recommendations from CMS, IDPH and DIA, we are announcing that as of Friday, March 12, indoor visits are now allowed with the following considerations. Please note, this visitation policy and the items within could change at any moment due to CMS recommendations, community spread or other factors.

Indoor Visits

Do these visiting guidelines apply to all On With Life persons served?

These are the updated visiting guidelines as of March 12, 2021. On With Life will allow indoor visitation for all residents unless the individual is in quarantine (for example, newly admitted or has confirmed COVID-19 infection).

Do visitors or persons served need to be vaccinated to visit indoors?

No, visits are allowed regardless of vaccination status. The only additional restriction in place regarding vaccination is that no physical contact is allowed unless the person served is fully vaccinated.

How many visitors are allowed at one time?

We will allow two visitors indoors at any one time per person served. These do not need to be designated visitors and can vary from visit to visit. Children are allowed, but they must follow the same screening and PPE guidelines.

When will visiting hours be?

Indoor visits will be allowed between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 8:00 p.m., 7 days a week. Special considerations will be made outside of these hours as needed.

How should I enter the building?

For indoor visits, please use the main entrance. Before entering On With Life, you will need to complete the self-screening process utilizing the screening kiosk located directly outside the main entrance. Once

the screening process is complete, a badge will be printed from the kiosk that will be required to be worn at all times throughout your visit. The entry door to On With Life will remain locked so you will need to utilize the red call button to be let into the facility.

Where will visits take place?

To limit visitor movement within the facility, we require that visits take place in the designated visiting areas. Upon entry and screening, our staff will direct you to an appropriate designated visiting area. Visitors should go directly to the designated visiting area and not walk around the facility. Outdoor visits will also be allowed; see section below on outdoor visits for additional information.

What infection control and PPE considerations are required for visiting?

All visitors will be required to be masked at all times and use appropriate hand hygiene. Please maintain social distancing of at least six feet. Physical contact is allowed if the person served is fully vaccinated. Additional PPE requirements may apply as medically necessary.

What if I have a fever, cough, shortness of breath or feel sick?

It is crucial that if you or the person served have any of these symptoms or feel sick that you do not enter the facility or visit your loved one outdoors.

Are students, interns or volunteers allowed at On With life?

This continues to be reviewed on a case-by-case basis. Vaccination status will play a key role in allowing these groups into On With Life.

What if I want to take my loved one on a day pass or home visit?

We will be allowing day passes and home visits on a case-by-case basis (to be discussed with the case management team).

Outdoor Visits

Are outdoor visits allowed?

Yes, outdoor visits will be allowed for up to two visitors per person served per visit unless arrangements are made ahead of time with the social worker. All appropriate infection control and prevention practices should be adhered to, including masking and social distancing.

What outdoor areas are best suited for visiting?

We ask that all outdoor visits stay within Owl's Nest courtyard. If visiting indoors and you would like to take your loved one outside, please alert the nursing staff and take the most direct route to the courtyard.
